Awards Juror SONYA TERPENING



Sonya Terpening has been an invited artist to the "Prix de West" at the National Cowboy and Western Heritage Museum for twenty-five years and participated in the "Masters of the American West" at the Autry Museum for twelve years. In 2008 she received the Autry Museum Award for Watercolor; was selected as NBC Oklahoma's "Oklahoma Artist" for 2017; was the recipient of the Smelser-Vallion Visiting Artist award from the Oklahoma State University Doel Reed Center for the Arts in 2010 and 2013; and was a Featured Artist at the 2006 "Rendezvous" at the Gilcrease Museum. Articles about Sonya's art have been featured in "Art of the West", "Western Art Collector", "Southwest Art" and "Persimmon Hill" magazines.

Sonya Terpening's paintings are in the permanent collection of The National Cowboy and Western Heritage Museum, OK City; State of Oklahoma - Capitol Building; The Gilcrease Museum, Tulsa; Edmond Law Library, Oklahoma State University, Stillwater; NBC Oklahoma, Altus—all in OK; National Cowgirl Museum and Hall of Fame, Fort Worth; Museum of the American Railroad, Frisco; The Pearce Museum, Corsicana—all in TX; and The Forbes Collection, New York, NY;

Though Sonya Terpening lived many years in Oklahoma and graduated from Oklahoma State University, Grapevine, Texas has been her home for 30 years. She feels that living in Oklahoma and Texas is living with the fable of the west. Both states are so rich in history and legend that as an artist she cannot help but seek it out and try to share it with others.

Sonya never made a great decision to become an artist; she just always knew that is what she wanted to be. Sonya studied with professional artists from the time she was in junior high school. She received an art degree at OSU but her advanced studies came from knowing and painting with some of the great American artists such as Bettina Steinke, Donald Teague and Lowell Ellsworth Smith.

Sonya Terpening's art is about sharing the great and fascinating world around her. "When something moves me, be it a story or a scene, I want to express it in color and light so that the viewer can share the feeling. There is nothing more beautiful than this great land and the people living in it. I am drawn not only to the American west as it exists today but also to its history. There is something about the past that we all share that makes us better for remembering it. I think art touches the soul and teaches in ways words cannot." About APA and the Theme of the Exhibit

The American Plains Artists or APA was first organized in 1982 as a small group of artists who banded together to highlight through their art, the variety to be found in the vast region known as the American Plains. Today, the APA has expanded into a nonprofit organization with a membership consisting of both signature and associate members. The goals have remained the same, to educate the public through traditional and representational art works about the American Plains region including the landscape, wildlife, peoples and way of life in historical or modern times. Sales commission of 40% will apply and will benefit both the Pearce Museum and the American Plains Artists.

Jury Process via Digital Entries

Initial jurying will be from the submitted Digital Entries sent via the APA website. To enter, go to the Show and Events tab and then the Juried Show Entry Page on the APA website. Then click on any of the highlighted links on that page for the prospectus or the entry form. Submitted entries will be reviewed by a panel of APA Signature Members on the aesthetic and technical skills of the artist in depicting the theme of the Great Plains. Awards Juror Sonya Terpening will choose works to receive awards after viewing the original works selected for inclusion in the exhibit.

Eligibility

Open to artists working in any traditional 2D or 3D fine art media in a realistic or representational manner reflecting the theme of the American Plains completed within the last three years, original work only and not previously shown in an Annual Juried APA Show. No photography or computergenerated art accepted.

- We must have both the image size of the artwork itself and the outside dimensions of the frame. The maximum size for 2D work is 1564 square inches including the outside dimension of the frame. An example of that is a 24" x 36" artwork with a five inch frame. Sculpture would be of moderate size and not exceed 100 pounds.
- Artwork must represent the theme of the show.
- All works must be for sale, with a 40% commission collected on all sales.

NEIGHBORING COUNTRIES' ARTISTS:

Due to the difficulties in returning unsold artworks to artists who live outside the USA borders, our neighboring countries' artists are required to make arrangements to have their artwork return-shipped to a gallery near the border in the USA or to a friend within the USA. It will be the responsibility of the neighboring countries' artists to pick up their artwork from that gallery or friend in the USA or make arrangements with the gallery or friend in the USA to get their artwork returned across the border.

Entry Procedure

Go to the" Shows and Events" and then to "Juried Art Show" on the APA website: www.americanplainsartists.com. The 2019 Entry Form and all the info about entering the show is on that page.

Please be sure to complete the Entry Form in its entirety. Be sure to put http://www.before your website address.

• Attach the digital images you wish to submit with the following guidelines. Your **digital images** must have a resolution of 300 dpi and be 700 pixels on the longest side of the artwork. The file should be kept under 3MB. See the video on the **Video Guide** Tab for help in preparing your images. (continued to next page)

Each two-dimensional jpg **file name** should be named as follows:

- Last Name, First Name Title of Art Size Media \$Price
- Example: Doeartist, John Kansas Skies 16x20 Oil \$1000.00

For 3D artists you may submit one or two additional images such as a side and back view or detail image to represent one entry. Your jpg file name format will be like this example:

- Doeartist, John Bronc Rider 15Hx10Lx10D Bronze \$2000.00
- Doeartist, John Bronc Rider side view 15Hx10Lx10D Bronze
- Doeartist, John Bronc Rider detail 15Hx10Lx10D Bronze

Once you have completed the entry form and attached your files, copy and paste or type the following four addresses into the address line: jennifer@americanplainsartists.com, jennifer@americanplainsartists.com, and judy@americanplainsartists.com, In the Subject Line type: APA Entry and your last name and first name (APA Entry Doe, Jane). Type any note you wish to send to us. Then send your email. Your entry files will be sent to the APA Image Recorder, Secretary, Historian, and President. We will later email you a copy of your entry for your records.

The entry fee and membership fee are to be paid via PayPal (either as a Member of PayPal [your password required] or as a Guest of PayPal [NO password required]) through the APA website in the amount of \$70.00 (\$35 Entry fee [includes up to three entries] and \$35 Membership fee—or just send the \$35 Entry fee if you paid your membership fee earlier in the year).

No entries accepted after this date, August 24, 2019

Note: SHIPPING INFORMATION

Accepted artists will be sent specific instructions in their acceptance letter for the shipment/delivery of artwork to the Pearce Museum.

- However, artists should be aware that they are responsible for all shipping costs to and from the museum and that there is a \$20 fee per crate/box. (See below.)
- Art should be sent in sturdy reusable containers. Do Not use Styrofoam peanuts of any kind. Bubblewrap is recommended.
- Accepted artists will pay \$20.00 to The Pearce Museum per crate/box for unboxing/uncrating-reboxing/recrating their artwork. It should be sent at the time the artists ship their work.
- If a new box or extra bubblewrap, etc. is needed to be purchased to re-pack the artwork, then a fee will be charged in addition to the \$20.00 boxing fee.
- All artwork must be sent and returned by Fed Ex or UPS paid by the artist. A pre-paid completed return label will be required by the end of the show.
